COUNCIL CHAMBERS
REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING
MINUTES
WEDNESDAY, MARCH 9, 2011

Mayor Michael C. Dahlgren called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m immediately following the Organizational meeting.

Present: Mayor Michael C. Dahlgren, Vice Mayor David Kintz, Mayor Pro Tem Catherine Higgins, Councilmember Fred Furtado, Councilmember Manny Fernandez, City Manager Mo Thornton, City Attorney Keith Davis, Police Chief Robert G. Mangold, Utilities Director Steve Mazuk and City Clerk Jude M. Goudreau.

Vice Mayor David Kintz made a motion to approve the minutes from City Council Meeting on January 19, 2011 and the Council Workshop on February 23, 2011. Councilmember Fred Furtado seconded the motion. Motion passed 5-0.

City Attorney Keith Davis read by title only Resolution 11-04, a resolution authorizing the mayor to sign an agreement with Community Asphalt for the 2011 road overlay project. Councilmember Manny Fernandez made a motion to approve the resolution. Vice Mayor Kintz seconded the motion. Motion passed 5-0

There was no Miscellaneous Business.

Mayor Dahlgren asked for public comments and there were none.

City Manager Mo Thornton gave the League of Cities report. The next meeting will be March 30, 2011 in Wellington. The Installation of Officers will be held at the Airport Hilton on May 27th. The League will be awarding scholarships to applicants in April. Mrs. Thornton said because of the new ethics regulations the Golf Tournament held for fundraising the scholarships may have to be put on hold. The next Ethics Committee meeting is next Wednesday March 16th. Mrs. Thornton gave the City Manager's report and informed Council that the Spring Fling planning is underway. The City has received donations and sponsorships. Wrist bands are available at City Hall for \$10 dollars. Sandy Thompson has suggested a book signing for the day of the Spring Fling, with part of the proceeds to go to the Spring Fling. She informed council that she is still working with the Tennis Court Resurfacing people and will keep council informed. She is gathering information regarding the radio system. The first step will be building a tower. The MPSCC Agreement should be available by the April Council Meeting. Mrs. Thornton said Steve Mazuk and Larry Hansen from IT-Smarts have been working on the camera system and, they were able to 2 additional cameras working. The next Pain Clinic Committee will meet on Friday, March 11, 2011 at 9:00 a.m. They are working on revising the Ordinance and should have it by the April or May Council Meeting. A letter went to the Auditor General regarding the Lake Worth Sewer Lawsuit, she will keep council informed. City Manager Thornton thanked everyone involved in the community day on March 5th, 2011 to assist an elderly widow with bringing her property up to minimum property standards. Volunteers through-out the city came forward to assist and donate money, materials and labor.

Chief Mangold gave the crime report for the month of February.

City Attorney Davis informed council that he is working with the Chief regarding the MPSCC agreement.

Mayor Dahlgren asked for Council comments: Councilmember Furtado said he has received comments from residents regarding the street lights being out in several locations in the city. Chief Mangold and Utility Director Mazuk have already addressed the situation and two of the lights have already been repaired. Councilmember Higgins congratulated Manny Fernandez and Mike Dahlgren on their re-election to council. They are both a great asset to council and she enjoys working with them. She reminded residents that there will be a tennis tournament at 2 p.m. on April 2, 2011 as part of the Spring Fling and encouraged everyone to attend. Interested parties should contact Judy Wilkinson. Mrs. Higgins thanked everyone who was appointed to the boards and everyone who applied for the board positions. Councilmember Kintz said he echoed Councilmember Higgins and also thanked all the volunteers and board members for their hard work. Councilmember Fernandez gave the financial report and said the city and utilities department are right on track with expenses. Revenue appears a little short but will be right on mark at the six month point. He thanked the Chief of Police for working with him on a recent issue with the security guards and said the situation is now resolved. Mayor Dahlgren congratulated everyone on a great job that they did on Saturday helping the resident at 405 North Country Club Drive. The mayor thanked everyone for their support and is looking forward to the next two years on council. He also commented that at today's League of Cities meeting, there was a discussion about the costs of elections imposed on cities now.

The Meeting adjourned at 7:30pm.
