REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
WEDNESDAY, JUNE 20, 2012  
MINUTES

Mayor Michael Dahlgren called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

Present at the meeting: Mayor Michael Dahlgren, Vice Mayor David Kintz, Mayor Pro Tem Catherine Higgins, Councilmember Manny Fernandez, City Manager Mo Thornton, City Attorney Keith Davis, Police Chief Robert Mangold, Utilities Director Steve Mazuk and City Clerk Jude M. Goudreau. Councilmember Fred Furtado was absent from the meeting.

Mayor Pro Tem Catherine Higgins made a motion to approve the minutes from the City Council Meeting on May 16, 2012. Vice Mayor David Kintz seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.

Attorney Davis read by title only Resolution 12-12- A Resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign an addendum agreement with M&M Asphalt for Road Construction Projects. Vice Mayor David Kintz made a motion to approve the resolution. Councilmember Manny Fernandez seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0.

Miscellaneous Business: There was none.

Mayor Dahlgren asked for comments from the public; Craig Mitchell 261 North Country Club commented on the track for the gate on JFK Drive, the accent lighting at the entrances and the puddle of water on Orange Tree Drive where the road was newly paved. Dale Carsrud of 241 Orange Tree Drive expressed his concern over the recent construction of a pool at 205 Gleneagles Drive, the recent road paving job and a resident power washing on a Sunday. Tom Evans of 350 Yorktowne Circle commented on the fountains in the lakes. Mr. Evans stated that he has never incurred any damage from them, just dirty windows.

City Manager Mo Thornton gave the League of Cities Report. The next meeting will be held on June 27<sup>th</sup> at Scripps, and you must RSVP to attend. The League is still working on a resolution to the issue regarding the 12.50 traffic money. The City will meet with Commissioner Shelley Vana again in the near future to discuss the issue. Under the City Manager's Report; the Mayor will be attending the League of Cities Annual Conference on behalf of the city and will need to be appointed as a voting delegate. Councilmember Manny Fernandez made a motion to appoint the Mayor as the City's Delegate. Vice Mayor David Kintz seconded the motion. Motion passed 4-0. Mrs. Thornton provided council with a suggestion from the fountain company to replace the center spray on the fountains in the lakes. A lengthy discussion followed. By consensus, Council would like her to obtain the cost for moving the fountains and would like a survey of the residents impacted by the fountains. She also entered into the meeting minutes, a letter regarding the fountains from Peter and Leslie Mugavero who could not be present at the meeting. The letter is attached hereto as part of the minutes.


Chief Robert Mangold gave the Crime Report for the month of May. He also informed Council that he recently attended a meeting with the Criminal Justice Commission; they are supporting the disbursement of the 12.50 money by sending a letter to the County

Commission showing their support. He is also asking the League of Cities to send a letter to the County Commission showing their support.

City Attorney Keith Davis reported on a letter received from Shelley Vana, regarding funding for the Inspector General's office. He recommends the city not act on the request and simply wait for the lawsuit to be resolved.

Mayor Dahlgren asked for comments from Council: Councilmember Manny Fernandez gave the City and Utilities Department financial reports. Mayor Pro Tem Catherine Higgins commented the new playground equipment looks great and she's glad we were able to have it installed before summer got under way. Vice Mayor David Kintz commented that since the County has finished the widening of South Congress Ave. speeding seems to have increased, making it more dangerous. Mayor Dahlgren echoed the other council minutes and thanked everyone for coming.
