MINUTES

Mayor Kintz called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Present were: Mayor David Kintz, Vice Mayor Catherine Higgins, Mayor Pro Tem Aaron Rinker, Councilmember Fred Furtado, Councilmember Ralph White, City Manager Mo Thornton, City Attorney Trela White, City Clerk Kristen Puhalainen, and Police Chief Robert Mangold.

Motion by Councilmember Furtado, second by Councilmember White, to approve the minutes of the City Council First Budget Hearing on September 10, 2015; City Council Final Budget Hearing on September 16, 2015; City Council Meeting on September 16, 2015. Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. White read Ordinance 438 by title, amending the city boundary in the charter. Mayor Kintz asked for public comments; there were none. Motion by Mayor Pro Tem Rinker, second by Vice Mayor Higgins to approve Ordinance 438 on final reading. Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. White read Resolution 15-21 by title, authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with the Supervisor of Elections for the 2016 Municipal Election. Mayor Kintz asked for public comments; there were none. Motion by Vice Mayor Higgins, second by Councilmember White to approve Resolution 15-21. Motion carried 5-0.

Resolution 15-22, Authorizing the Mayor to Sign an Agreement with Southern Waste Systems, was pulled from the agenda at the request of Southern Waste Systems.

Ms. White read Resolution 15-23 by title, authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with Palm Beach County for Information Technology Services. Motion by Councilmember White, second by Mayor Pro Tem Rinker to approve Resolution 15-23. Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. White read Resolution 15-24 by title, authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with Bulldog Fencing for Gate and Fence replacement. Motion by Councilmember Furtado, second by Mayor Pro Tem Rinker to approve Resolution 15-24. Motion carried 5-0.

Mayor Kintz asked for comments from the public. Elyse Underberg of 316 Fairway Court asked about the work being done at the Lantana airport, and commented on the South Country Club Drive paving project. Leslie Leckrone of 569 S. Country Club Drive spoke on stroke awareness.

Ms. Thornton gave the League of Cities Report: the October meeting is at the Lake Worth Casino; the topic is telecommunications.

Ms. Thornton gave the Treasurer's Report: We are 90% closed on the budget for Fiscal Year 2014-2015. The auditors start their work on November 16.

Ms. Thornton gave the Manager's Report: The South Country Club road project is underway. The Christmas lights are up; they'll be turned on November 24<sup>th</sup>. The fiber optic project with the County is scheduled to begin as soon as possible. The replacement of the west entrance gate will begin when the holiday lights come down. The bridge aesthetics project planning phase has begun; a Council workshop with the designer will be scheduled to determine the vision for the project.

Chief Mangold gave the crime report for September, and read letters of commendation for Officers Ferrara and Dombeck, and for those stationed at the hospital.

Ms. White had nothing to report.

Mayor Kintz asked for comments from Council:

Councilmember Furtado addressed Ms. Leckrone's comments, and asked about the qualifying period for the next municipal election.

Councilmember White addressed Ms. Leckrone's comments.

Mayor Pro Tem Rinker commented on the South Country Club Drive road project.

Vice Mayor Higgins commented on the lights at the guardhouses.

Mayor Kintz proposed enlisting a public relations firm to assist the city with media events. Ms. Thornton supported the proposal. Chief Mangold reported that he plans to assign a staff member as Public Information Officer.
