MINUTES

Mayor Kintz called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Present were: Mayor David Kintz, Vice Mayor Catherine Higgins, Mayor Pro Tem Aaron Rinker, Councilmember Fred Furtado, Councilmember Ralph White, City Manager Mo Thornton, City Attorney Jack Rice, City Clerk Kristen Puhalainen, Police Chief Robert Mangold, and Utilities Director Steve Mazuk.

Motion by Mayor Pro Tem Rinker, second by Councilmember White, to approve the minutes of the City Council Meeting on November 18, 2015. Motion carried 5-0.

Mr. Rice read Resolution 15-25 by title, appointing a city canvassing board to serve in the event of a run-off for the March 15, 2016 election. Mayor Kintz asked for public comment; there was none. Motion by Councilmember White, second by Mayor Pro Tem Rinker to approve Resolution 15-25. Motion carried 5-0.

Mayor Kintz asked for comments from the public. William Mitchell of 261 Orange Tree Drive commented on the holiday lights in the city. Van Duke of 221 Orange Tree Drive commented on the security guards.

Ms. Thornton gave the League of Cities Report: the next meeting will be January 27<sup>th</sup>. The Annual Tri-Cities Barbecue was a success.

Ms. Thornton gave the Financial Report: The auditors are done with their field work. At the end of the fiscal year the general fund was up \$50,000, before depreciation. The audit can't be completed without the GASB 68 information; the presentation will be in February or March. The City has received almost one million dollars of the 2015/16 ad valorem tax revenue.

Ms. Thornton gave the Manager's Report: The South Country Club Drive road project has been delayed by rain. The City has received a quote of \$5,000 from Ron Sachs for the development of a crisis management plan. Jon Schmidt & Associates will present proposals for bridge upgrades in January. The storage facility has their permits. The site plan for the 7-ll has been approved. The Golf Cart Parade event was a success; a record 1,006 dinners were served. The City's tree bonfire event is January 10<sup>th</sup>. She wished everyone Happy Holidays and a Happy New Year.

Chief Mangold gave the crime report for November. A suspect in the recent auto burglaries has been arrested.

Mr. Rice wished everyone a Merry Christmas.

Mayor Kintz asked for comments from Council:

Councilmember Furtado commented on the South Country Club Drive project.


Councilmember White commented on the parade and wished everyone Happy Holidays.

Mayor Pro Tem Rinker commented on the home decorating contest and wished everyone a Happy Hanukkah and Merry Christmas.


