CITY COUNCIL MEETING

And conclusion of Council Workshop

MINUTES

Mayor Kintz called the meeting to order at 7:57 p.m.

Present were: Mayor David Kintz, Vice Mayor Catherine Higgins, Mayor Pro Tem Aaron Rinker, Councilmember Michael LaCoursiere, Councilmember Lauri Melear, City Manager Mo Thornton, City Attorney Jennifer Ashton, City Clerk Kristen Puhalainen, Police Chief Robert Mangold, and Public Works Director Steve Mazuk.

Motion by Mayor Pro Tem Rinker, second by Vice Mayor Higgins to approve the minutes of the Budget Workshop and City Council Meeting on August 10, 2016, and the First Budget Hearing on September 14, 2016. Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. Ashton read Resolution 16-15 by title, authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with Hinterland Group for miscellaneous drainage projects. Mayor Kintz asked for comments from the public; there were none. Motion by Mayor Pro Tem Rinker, second by Councilmember Melear to approve Resolution 16-15. There was no discussion. Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. Ashton read Resolution 16-16, authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with Fast Dry to resurface the tennis and basketball courts. Mayor Kintz asked for comments from the public; there were none. Motion by Councilmember LaCoursiere, second by Mayor Pro Tem Rinker to approve Resolution 16-16. Motion carried 5-0.

In Miscellaneous Business, Ms. Thornton introduced Ellen Smith from Waste Management, who answered questions from the Council on the City's trash service.

Ms. Thornton explained the proposed road projects for Fiscal Year 2017. The proposal from Hardrives Inc. was under the budgeted estimate. The contract will be brought to Council for approval. She asked for input on road striping; the Council by consensus supported it.

Ms. Thornton explained the plan for public education on the proposed sales tax increase on the November ballot. Ms. Ashton explained that the City can educate on the issue, but not advocate for it. Ms. Thornton asked for Council input on whether the City should educate its residents on the referendum; the Council by consensus supported education.

Mayor Kintz asked for comments from the public. Craig Mitchell of 261 N. Country Club Drive commented on the road repairs on S. Country Club Drive

Ms. Thornton gave the League of Cities Report: The next meeting is September 28th in West Palm Beach.

Ms. Thornton gave the Manager's Report: She reported on the annexation plans of Palm Springs, mosquito control, and upcoming city events.

Chief Mangold gave the crime report for August. Ms. Thornton read a letter from a resident thanking Police Officers Jason Martino, Michael Dombeck, and Sgt. Craig Brown for their during an emergency situation.

Ms. Ashton had no report.

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Mayor Kintz asked for comments from Council:

Councilmember LaCoursiere commented on code enforcement.


Councilmember Melear commented on the newsletter and the hospital's expansion plans.

Mayor Pro Tem Rinker complimented Ms. Ashton on her participation in the ethics training at the College.


Vice Mayor Higgins commented on her conflict of interest with regard to the JFK Hospital workshop held earlier, and possible code issues on N. Country Club Drive.
