The City of Atlantis Council Meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. on January 20th.

Resolution No. 16-01, to fill a vacancy on the City Council due to the resignation of Mr. Ralph White, passed 3-0. Mr. & Mrs. White are moving from Atlantis. Mr. Michael LaCoursiere was appointed by Council to assume the remainder of Mr. White's term. In order to do this, he resigned from his current position on the Board of Adjustment. Congratulations and best of luck!

Resolution No. 16-02, authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with Zambelli Fireworks for fireworks at Spring Fling passed 4-0. The total cost will be \$11,000.

In Miscellaneous Business, Mayor David Kintz proudly read a Proclamation honoring Mr. Fred Furtado and his legacy as a Mayor and Councilmember of Atlantis. The Council, City Manager and City Attorney recollected what Mr. Furtado meant to them and how happy they were to have known and worked with him. He will be greatly missed. His children, David and Cynthia, were present.

The City Manager reported that the Christmas Tree Bonfire party held at the Atlantis Country Club was a huge success. The Club and our city employees were all thanked for their efforts.

City Attorney and resident Trela White was named in the *South Florida Legal Guide* as one of two of the best municipal attorneys in Palm Beach County. Congratulations Trela!

Community Safety through Community Awareness and Involvement:

Crime Prevention Tip: If You See Something , Say Something - It Takes a Community to Protect a Community

"If You See Something, Say Something™" is a national campaign that raises public awareness of the indicators of terrorism and terrorism-related crime, as well as the importance of reporting any suspicious activity to state and local law enforcement.

Informed, alert communities play a critical role in keeping our nation safe. To report suspicious activity, contact your local law enforcement agency. Describe specifically what you observed, including:

- **Who** or **what** you saw;
- **When** you saw it;
- **Where** it occurred; and
- **Why** it's suspicious.

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate terrorism, terrorism-related crime, or any type of criminal activity. This includes, but is not limited to:

- **Unusual items or situations:** A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.
- **Eliciting information:** A person questions individuals at a level beyond curiosity about a building's purpose, operations, security procedures and/or personnel, shift changes, etc.
- **Observation/surveillance:** Someone pays unusual attention to facilities or buildings beyond a casual or professional interest. This includes extended loitering without explanation (particularly in concealed locations); unusual, repeated, and/or prolonged observation of a building (e.g., with binoculars or video camera); taking notes or measurements; counting paces; sketching floor plans, etc.

Some of these activities could be innocent—it's up to law enforcement to determine whether the behavior warrants investigation. The activities above are not all-inclusive, but have been compiled based on studies of pre-operational aspects of both successful and thwarted terrorist events over several years.

FRED FURTADO

The Mayor and Council presented a proclamation at the January City Council Meeting honoring Councilmember Fred Furtado, who passed away on December 25, 2015. I would like to share the following tribute to Fred.

Fred was first and foremost a family man. He and his wife Lynn raised their family on Gleneagles Drive. He was retired from the Sheriff's office when he came on to council in 1998. He lost his beloved Lynn to cancer several years later. He loved having his children nearby and saw them often. He regularly attended the sports games of his grandchildren and shared the stories of their athletic success. Madeline, Hunter and Anthony – he was very proud of you!

As a council member, Fred was a statesman and he served with distinction. He always considered what was in the best interest of the city when making decisions. He understood the leadership role he played in the community. His quiet confidence and decades of public service prepared him to be a councilman and our mayor. He was accessible. He made friends easily and if someone had a question or complaint he took the time to listen, follow up with me and get back to the person. He never made up stories or spread gossip; he always made sure he had the facts.

Many is the time when he came to see me, he would pull the cocktail napkin out of his pocket, where he had written the question someone had asked him at dinner the night before, to discuss the topic. He would share his opinion freely with me. We didn't always agree, but I knew he and I were on the same page in doing what was best for the city. The last time I spoke to him, we were speaking about a city issue. We were having a bit of a spirited discussion, and in the end we agreed. I chuckled and said "I love you Fred." He told me he loved me too.

On a personal level, he was like a father to me and a grandfather to my daughter. He teased her when she was young, and as she grew older she teased him back. He was my mentor and my friend. I am truly going to miss him.


