Foundation for Transplants. All contributions to this foundation are tax deductible. We are a great city that cares for the people who care for us and a little can go a long way for Michael. All donations need to flow through City Hall as he is a city employee, and the City can ensure that all gift reporting and ethics requirements are met. Further details on how to make a donation are on the next page. Please consider donating if you can and add him to your prayers for a happy and healthy outcome to the situation.

Manager's Notes May 2016

I would like to echo the Mayor's sentiments on our wonderful Spring Fling event. We could not put on this wonderful day without our dedicated volunteers. The specifics are elsewhere in the newsletter, but I would like to personally thank our volunteer committee; Pat Matulis, Susan Methfessel, Carol Johnson, Cathy Nothnagle, Judy Wilkinson, Janet Rosenberg, Maureen Cleary, Bobby Dicks and Trina Weisman. These ladies dedicate their time and their talents to make this one of the premier events for the city. Thanks also to the Atlantis Country Club. Their professional staff prepares all the wonderful food and generously makes their facility available for our event. Thank you one and all!

As you read in the Mayor's column, our dispatcher Michael Emmons is in need of a kidney transplant. Any of you who have left a door open between 11:00 pm and 7:00 am have probably gotten a call from Mike to tell you. While you may have never met him, Mike has been our midnight shift dispatcher for over 20 years. Because we are a public agency, we are bound by the Palm Beach County Ethics Ordinance. As such, we need to track the donations for Mike as he is required to file periodic gift disclosures. He has established a relationship with the National Foundation for Transplants to assist him in his efforts. Even with health insurance, he is facing significant expenses related to the surgery. The transplant center is in Orlando, resulting in substantial travel related expenses. After the transplant he will be on anti-rejection medication for the rest of his life.

If you wish to make a donation, please make your check out to "NFT Florida Transplant Fund", write "In Honor of Michael Emmons" on the memo line. Donations should be sent to City Hall so that we can log them and send them on to the foundation. This will assist Mike in filing his required gift disclosure. If you wish to donate by credit card, visit www.transplants.org to make a secure donation. Click "Find an NFT Patient" to search for him. Please notify us if you do this so we can assist Mike in tracking the donations.

Though Mike is currently on dialysis, he never misses his shift. Mike serves as an inspiration to all of us through his commitment to live a productive life in spite of the difficulties he faces.

City News...

The City of Atlantis Council Meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. on April 20th.

Driving from Port St. Lucie, Howard Tipton presented the city with a Certificate of Recognition on behalf of the International City/County Management Assoc. and the Florida City & County Management Assoc. for our Council/Manager form of government that has been successful for over 40 years.

Ordinance No. 439 passed 4-1. This amends Chapter 9-29, Schedule of Business Taxes, to increase the fees by 5% as allowed by law every other year.

Resolution 16-06, adopting the City's Infrastructure Improvement Project List, passed 5-0. This list is in place in the event the vote on November 8th passes the proposed 1% Infrastructure surtax.

Also passing 5-0: Resolution 16-07 authorizes the Mayor to sign an Interlocal Agreement with Palm Beach

County and the School Board to facilitate the sales tax referendum.

After a long discussion, Resolution 16-08 passed 4-1. This supports the concept of the Atlanta Braves Spring training facility in South Central Palm Beach County.

In Miscellaneous Business, Atlantis Dispatcher Mr. Michael Emmons and his wife were present. Michael is in need of a kidney transplant. The Council supported this effort 5-0.

Council thanked the City Manager, Public Works Director, and Police Chief for their hard work making the Spring Fling so successful and well-attended. The fireworks were said to be the best ever.

Community Safety through Community Awareness and Involvement:

Crime Prevention Tip: Darklist - Many of our residents will soon be heading to summer homes in other states. The police department recommends that these residents help to ensure the security of their homes by listing them with the department prior to departing Atlantis. Once we receive the necessary information, and the home is unoccupied, police officers will perform periodic security checks of these residences. If anything is found to be amiss, the resident and /or their emergency contact will be notified so that appropriate action can be taken to correct the problem(s). The House Watch form can be accessed online at www.atlantisfl.gov , click on the Police Department link then on the Security House Checks link, or call the police department and provide your information to the dispatcher.

Autism Awareness: April was National Autism Awareness Month and with the diagnosis of autism rising to one in 68 children it is important to recognize the sometimes subtle cues of autism.

- 50% of people with autism communicate non-verbally. They may not respond to your verbal commands, and may cover their ears, look away, or run away when approached.
- They may toe walk, have a pigeon-toed gait or a running style.
- They may appear psychotic, or under the influence of alcohol/drugs.
- Their responses reflect changes in their sensory perception: lights, sirens, canine partners, odors will escalate repetitive behaviors (pacing, hand flapping, twirling hands, self-hitting, screaming).
- Some will attempt to present an autism information card or wear medical alert identification.
- They may not recognize police vehicle, badge or uniform or have any inkling of what is expected of them if they do.
- They frequently appear argumentative, belligerent, or stubborn. They may consistently ask "Why?" or respond "No" to all questions.
- They may parrot (repeat exactly) what the officer says.
- They will have difficulty interpreting your body language.
- They are generally poor listeners.
- They may have a passive monotone voice, and pronounce words unusually.
- They may have difficulty judging personal space; standing too close or too far away from you.
- They frequently perseverate on a favorite topic when they feel uncomfortable; rambling about favorite sports teams, train, bus or plane schedules, city names, foods, etc.
- They are consistently very honest, (sometimes too honest), they do not lie, are blunt, but not very tactful.

All Atlantis Police Officers undergo 40 hours of Critical Incident Training and additional training specific to autism so that we can recognize and deal appropriately with individuals in distress.

PGA HOPE Kicks off Spring Programs

PGA HOPE (Helping our Patriots Everywhere) has kicked off the spring season in two regions of south Florida: Palm Beach County and Miami. The HOPE program provides all veterans with FREE golf instruction taught by local PGA Professionals.

Curbside items may only be placed at the curb after 5:00 pm on the day before collection. *Exception, on the first Sunday of each month items may be placed at the curb after noon for Monday pickup. **Please use your underground containers.** Liners may be obtained at Ace Hardware. Recycle containers may be obtained at City Hall. For repairs and replacement contact Jim Shelhamer at 561-718-8207.

Landscape debris generated by a paid landscape maintenance company must be removed on the day of generation by the maintenance company. (City of Atlantis Code of Ordinances 8.3-9) Questions, Call City Hall at 965-1744.
