## Manager's Notes January 2017

We were a busy community in December. The Golf Cart Parade was well attended, with over 1,000 meals served. Our thanks to Marti and her crew at the Atlantis Country Club for producing such a delicious meal, and for service was so efficient that there was seldom a long line for food. Our thanks also to the volunteers who worked the event and the residents who spent the time to decorate their carts and participate in the parade; there were 25 wonderfully decorated carts entered. Details of the event and the winners are on page 7.

We also completed our resurfacing of the tennis courts in December. The tennis courts and the basketball court look beautiful. We added more cushion to the surface of the tennis courts. My regular players tell me they are spectacular.

Paving was completed in December and the finishing touches on our road project will take place in January. The striping will likely be done by the time the newsletter reaches you. Remaining still is the replacement of the paver bricks at the west entrance. At this writing, I do not yet have a schedule as to when this work will be done. It will be necessary to close the entrance and exit lanes to do the work.

During the paving project we did our best to notify the community as to the road closures and detour routes. Our system will call, text and email messages when we need to notify the community. However, in order for you to receive the messages, we need your contact information. We had reports that some people are still not signed up for the system. ### Community Safety through Community Awareness and Involvement:

#### **Crime Prevention Tip: ALERT: As the jackpot grows, beware of lottery scams!**

Due to Mega Millions very large jackpots, we have seen an uptick in inquiries from people receiving phone calls or emails from “Mega Millions” indicating that they have won big! The entities making these calls or sending these emails are falsely using the Mega Millions name, and the name of other legitimate lottery or technology/internet companies, in an attempt to appear legitimate.

There are no such things as the “United States National Lottery” or the “Mega Millions Mobile Lottery” or the “Mega Millions Corporation” or the “Mega Millions International Lottery” – these are all attempts to look legitimate in order to scam people out of their money.

The state lotteries that participate in Mega Millions remind everyone to be suspicious when anyone you don't know tells you you've won Mega Millions. Except in extremely rare circumstances, no one involved with the Mega Millions game has any way of knowing whether you have a winning ticket or not. And remember, you must have already purchased a Mega Millions ticket from an American lottery in order to win our game. There is absolutely no other way to win!

In a fake lottery scam, if the person is fooled into thinking he or she has won a prize, the crooks usually try to get the person to wire money for “taxes” or “fees.” They may also try to get the victim to provide them with a bank account number, which they will then clean out. Another trick is to send the winner a bogus “check” and ask the winner to send money back to cover expenses. It is only after victims have sent their own money that they discover the check they received is counterfeit.

Here are some tips that can prevent you from being scammed:

- Mega Millions is not an organization. If someone claims to be from “Mega Millions,” that's a warning sign.
- If you didn't buy an actual Mega Millions ticket, you haven't won Mega Millions. You can't win a legitimate lottery if you didn't buy a ticket.
- No real lottery tells winners to put up their own money in order to collect a prize they have already won. If you have to pay a fee to collect your winnings, you haven't won.
- Mega Millions is only played in the United States. If you receive a call or e-mail from outside of the U.S. or if you're told the prize is in pounds, Euros, or anything other than dollars, that is a warning sign.
- If you have caller-ID on your phone, check the area code when someone calls to tell you you've won. If it is from outside of your home state, that is a red flag. Also, be aware that some con artists use technology that allows them to disguise their area code: although it may look like they're calling from your state, they could be anywhere in the world.
- Many scams operate outside of the U. S., so be suspicious if an e-mail contains misspellings or poor grammar, or if the person who calls you speaks broken English.
- If you are told that you need to keep your “win” confidential, be suspicious.

- Just because Mega Millions is mentioned does not necessarily make it a real prize. Scammers will use the Mega Millions name without permission
- If you are told the “prize” can be wired directly into your bank account, do not give out your bank account or other personal information.
- If you are told that you can “verify” the prize by calling a certain number, that number may be part of the scam. Instead of calling it, you should look up the name of the lottery or organization on your own to find out its real contact information.

To file a complaint or get free information call toll-free, 1-877-FTC-HELP (1-877-382-4357). If you have been the victim of a scam, contact your local police or sheriff’s office or state police.

**Pedestrians & Motorists – Sharing the Roadways**

Periodically the police department deals with calls regarding conflicts between motorists and pedestrians over the use of the roadways. Obviously the city does not have sidewalks, and therefore residents use city streets for walking, jogging, bicycling, etc. It behooves both sets of users, motorists and pedestrians, to respect each other’s rights regarding the roadways and amicably share the streets. Resident motorists that insist on strictly applying the traffic laws in the exercise of their rights, regardless of pedestrian safety, prevent other residents from enjoying the aforesaid recreational pastimes and endanger adults and children alike. Conversely, residents that obstruct motorists by walking and bicycling two and three abreast, and failing to move to the side of the road when approached by vehicular traffic, violate state laws thereby endangering themselves and provoking motorists.

All pedestrians, by state statute, must walk only on the shoulder of the roadway facing oncoming traffic. This law affects the ability of a family or group of people to take a leisurely walk together, and because of that, it is not strictly enforced. However, pedestrians must move to the shoulder of the road, yielding the right-of-way, when vehicles draw near; this will give motorists sufficient room to safely pass pedestrians. Motorists must use due care and exercise proper precaution, such as slowing down and giving pedestrians, cyclists, etc. as wide a berth as possible when passing them.

The police department will take swift action against any person(s) that by their actions threaten public safety, or that diminish the inherent quality of life in Atlantis.

**Don't forget to start off the new year by picking up your new auto decals & telephone directory!**

You can pick up the new City Directory and 2017 vehicle decals **beginning on Monday, January 2nd**. They will be available for distribution in Council Chambers at City Hall on weekdays **through Friday, January 13 from 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM**. We'll stay "open" until **6:00 PM on January 2<sup>nd</sup> and January 3<sup>rd</sup> until 6:30 PM**. If you can't make it to Council Chambers during the 2-week timeframe that our volunteers will be distributing them, directories and decals will be available 24/7 at the Police Department.

Auto decals are part of the City's security system, and all residents are strongly encouraged to display current decals on their windshields. **Please remember to bring the registration card for each vehicle that needs a decal.**

NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that the City of Atlantis, Florida, will hold its Municipal Election on Tuesday, March 14, 2017, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. for the purpose of electing two councilmembers, each for a term of (2) years. There will be one councilmember elected representing Seat 2, and one councilmember elected representing Seat 4. Candidates must be a qualified elector of the City of Atlantis.

The first day of qualifying begins January 27, 2017 at noon, and the final day for qualifying is February 14, 2017 by noon. Candidates must file in person with the City Clerk at City Hall, 260 Orange Tree Drive, Atlantis, Florida, during regular office hours (Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) until said date and time. Each candidate shall be voted upon by the electorate at large.

Registered voters in Precinct 3082 are qualified to vote in this election. To qualify as a registered voter for this General Election, you must register with the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections by February 14, 2017.

In the event of a tie vote between candidates receiving the highest number of votes cast for any office, a Run-Off Election shall be held on Tuesday, March 28, 2017. To qualify as a registered voter for the Run-Off Election, you must register with the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections by February 27, 2017.

Seat 2 is currently held by Aaron Rinker. Seat 4 is currently held by Michael LaCoursiere.
