

## Manager's Notes February 2015

I had several people email me with the correct answer to my Directory Trivia question. Congratulations to Norma Poretz who was the first to email me with the correct answer. This month's question will be a little tougher.

Who's second home is the farthest west in the United States?

Residential utility bills are mailed on a bi-monthly basis. They are generally mailed on the 25th of the odd numbered months, and due on the 12th of the even numbered months. That is to say that the bill you received at the end of January is due on February 12. Several methods are available for bill payment. Our customers can mail a check to our office, pay cash at our office, pay by credit card through the city's web site or sign up for Autodraft with the city. With Autodraft we initiate an ACH debit to your account early in the month, before the due date. Some customers use the banking software to schedule payment through their bank. Last billing cycle we had a problem receiving payment from some of those customers who scheduled their payments through the bank. When you pay your bill this way, the bank writes the check and mails it to our office. There is no electronic transfer or guarantee that it will reach us by the due date, even though the bank shows it as deducted from your account. In December, some of those payments reached our office after the due date, resulting in late payment charges and service termination notices. Please be aware if you are using this method that payment must reach us by the due date in order to be considered timely. Make sure you are scheduling payment early enough in the month so that penalties are not assessed. If you have questions about a payment or wish to sign up for auto draft please see Kathleen In our office.

**City News...**

The City of Atlantis Local Planning Agency was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on January 21st.

Consideration of proposed Ordinance No. 429, which would amend the Code of Ordinances to create an entirely new zoning district entitled "Commercial General." If passed, this district would provide for permitted, accessory and special exception uses, provide new plot and parcel requirements, and amend the city's PUD code regarding permissible uses and PUD size requirements. The proposed new CG Zoning District would also adopt landscaping and parking requirements. This district could include our current Atlantis Chevron gas station and any other future annexed commercial property along Congress Ave. and Military Trail.

After discussion and hearing from residents, a vote was taken. Support of the proposed Ordinance achieved a 2-2 vote. Mayor David Kintz was not in attendance.

Immediately following the Local Planning

Agency meeting, the Safe Neighborhood Improvement District Board of Directors meeting took place. By a 4-0 vote, Michael Prester was appointed to the committee.

The City Council meeting was called to order at 7:45 p.m. with Vice Mayor Catherine Higgins presiding.

Ordinance No. 429, adopting a new zoning district, was pulled from the agenda until further notice, because there was no consensus by the LPA.

Resolution No. 15-01 passed 4-0. This appoints the Supervisor of Elections to the Atlantis Canvassing Board for the 2015 election.

Resolution No. 15-02, authorizing the Mayor to sign and "Agreement for Vote Processing Equipment Use and Election Services" with the Supervisor of Elections, also passed 4-0.

Passing 4-0, Resolution NO. 15-03 authorizes the Mayor to sign a Fireworks Display Agreement with Zambelli Fireworks for the City's "Spring Fling" event.

Community Safety through Community Awareness and Involvement:

**Municipal Code Tip: Code enforcement has had several problems recently regarding vegetative waste from lawn maintenance companies being left for pick up by the City SWA vendor. Please review the following City Code.**

Sec. 8.3-8. - Collection of vegetative waste.

Vegetative waste shall be collected within the city at least one time per week. No changes in routes or collection days shall be made without the advance approval of the city manager and reasonable notification of customers.

(b) The collector shall have the exclusive rights to provide vegetative waste collection and disposal service within the city but shall not be required to collect vegetative waste generated by landscape maintenance companies or such similar entities; see [section 8.3-9](#) below.

(c) Tree trunks or branches and limbs of trees shall be cut into lengths of four feet or less and no single piece shall exceed 50 pounds in weight.

(d) All vegetative waste shall be placed immediately in front of the premises but not on the paved street.

(e) No vegetative waste shall be placed within ten feet of any structure, including, but not limited to any wall, fence, tree, water valve box, manhole, stormwater catch basin, mailbox or any other obstruction at anytime whatsoever.

(Ord. No. 284, § 1, 12-17-97)

- Sec. 8.3-9. - Removal of grass, trees, etc.

**It shall be the responsibility of all individuals and business entities who engage in the business of lawn or garden care for hire within the city to remove from the city all accumulations of grass, tree or shrubbery cuttings and all other waste incident to their maintenance of lawns, shrubberies and trees on the same calendar day that said waste is created or accumulated. Failure to do so shall be deemed a violation of this section and shall be punishable as hereinafter provided in [section 8.3-11](#).**

### *Literary Society*



On their 10th try, J.R. and Colin List of Boynton Beach finally won the Leon "Pop Sikes Father-Son Team Championship at Atlantis Country Club. A stroke behind after the first round, the Lists matched par-72 the final day (Sunday, Dec. 28) for 147 and won by four shots.

By comparison, make it two wins in two starts for Kevin and Alexa Hammer, also of Boynton Beach, in the Sikes Parent-Child tournament which followed December 29. Playing the same alternate shots format, the Hammers won this time with a score of four over 76, compared to par-72 in 2012.

"We just kept the ball in play better than we have in previous years," said Colin List, 25, a former Villanova University golfer. They made two birdies and five bogeys the first round, four apiece in the finale. "We were able to avoid the doubles (bogeys) and triples that we'd make in the past."

It was their third Father-Son victory of the year following the PNC pro-am in Orlando earlier this month and the Pater-Filius at Midlothian, Ill., CC the past summer.

Coincidentally, J.R. and another son, Braden, were low net in the pro division, also with 147. Braden, a former mini-tour player, is in the process of regaining his amateur status and there could be two List teams in future Sikes amateur flights.

J.R. List owns and operates List Industries, which manufactures lockers used by schools, clubs and sports facilities, with plants in Deerfield Beach and Apopka. Both sons currently work for the company.

The pro division, in which at least one member of the team is a professional golfer, was won by Mike and Brad Gray of Palm Beach Gardens. They beat the defending champions, Kirk and Josh Stauffer of Bradford, PA, on the second playoff hole after they tied at 146. They halved the first playoff hole, No. 10, with par-3s, returned to the tee and Brad won the playoff with a three foot putt for bogey-4 after Josh Stauffer missed a four footer for bogey. The Stauffers, the first round leaders, began the final round with a nine on a lost ball, adding five birdies and four bogeys for 75.

"Winning is always a big deal," said Kevin Hammer, who won the 1988 Junior Orange Bowl and four Palm Beach County Golf Association titles between 2006 and 2009 before beginning to escort his daughter around the country for junior tournaments. "We were out of town last year but we won't miss this one anymore," he added.

Noted Alexa, 17, a senior at American Heritage School in Delray Beach, "This wasn't a good day but it was good enough to win." They birdied the par-4 16th hole, their seventh of the day after a shotgun start, and made five bogeys.

In net division play for the 52-team field, Scott and Bobby Butler of North Palm Beach won with 65. Scott and his dad, Kevin, won the net division Sunday.

The 61st annual Sikes Father-Son drew 50 teams in the amateur division and 20 pro pairings. The pro flight was added in 1994. The Parent-Child began in 2001, evolving from the Father-Daughter, which started in 1977. There were 52 twosomes this year.

### *The Golf "Buzz" Continues at the Country Club*

PGA tour stars Keegan Bradley, Peter Uihlein, Kevin Tway, Justin Peters and Morgan Hoffman played in the 9th Annual Holiday Team Championship presented by the Gunslinger Tour. Thirty-two teams participated in the event and the pros were impressed with the course conditions, especially the Champion Ultradwarf greens. Keegan Bradley commented "the greens are as good as any tour event we play."

Winegardner and Daniel Obremski of Pittsburgh outlasted PGA tour players Kevin Tway of Edmond, OK, and Peter Uihlein of Palm Beach Gardens after they tied at 13 under par at the Atlantis Country Club.

Charlie Winegardner of Lothian, MD, sank a 12-foot birdie putt on the sixth extra hole for the win, then headed for the airport to catch a flight home for the holidays about an hour and a half later and his \$1000 share of the prize money.

## **Trash Talk**

Welcome to this first column about recycling in Atlantis. The SWS Service has a good program and recycles many items, and it is easy to use and evidenced by many blue and yellow bins around the city on Thursday.

However, today I want to briefly discuss an important service offered by the City of Atlantis. Disposal of medications is one of the most difficult. Unfortunately, many of us over the years got in the habit of throwing old, unused medications down the drain or toilet. This is a very bad idea for one big reason: medications pass through the wastewater treatment plant and are being discharged into local surface water and groundwater. Since the water table in Florida is so high, it is not difficult for medications disposed of through the water system to leech into our public water sources.

So, what to do? The Atlantis Police Department has provided us with an ideal solution. Located in the lobby of the Police Department in the City Hall Building is a large red disposal unit. You may dispose of all medications—pills, ointments, sprays, inhalers, and even pet medications in this container. The only item ineligible for disposal is needles. You open the door to the disposal unit, like the door in a mail box, and just throw the medication containers in the red box. Since this office is open day and night, you can dispose of your medications beyond regular hours of business.
