**City News...**

The City of Atlantis Council Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on November 18th.

Resolution No. 15-22, authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with Southern Waste Systems for garbage, vegetation, trash and recycling collection passed 5-0. Hurricane debris is also included. Total monthly cost is \$20,088.19.

The City Manager reported that the new lift station on Troon Avenue is nearly complete and that the work on the roadway at S. Country Club Drive should be finished by mid-December. She stated that there was a nice attendance at the Art Show and reminded everyone about the Golf Cart Parade to be held on December 14th.

The Police Chief reported that between November 8th and 17th there were five cars in the 300 block of Glenbrook Drive that were burglarized and on Atlantic Estates Way a car was stolen. This was the work of outside teenagers, who had done this same thing last year in Atlantis. All of the involved vehicles had been left unlocked. Always remember to lock your car and if possible, keep your car out of sight in your garage. This also helps to keep your house safer by not broadcasting when you are home or not home.

Community Safety through Community Awareness and Involvement:

Crime Prevention Tip - Holiday Safety: The police department wants to remind everyone that this is the season for crimes of opportunity, such as purse snatching and car burglaries. Citizens need to exercise extra care when shopping and carrying armloads of packages to parked cars:

1. Do not shop alone and avoid shopping at night
2. Avoid carrying large sums of money, use credit/debit cards to shop
3. When approaching or leaving your vehicle be aware of your surroundings and observant of others in your immediate vicinity
4. Lock your vehicle when you park it and if you must shop at night, park in a well lighted area
5. Be prepared to enter your vehicle without having to rummage for your car keys
6. Ask mall or store security for an escort if there is any suspicious activity near your vehicle
7. Do not leave valuables in plain sight in unoccupied vehicles
8. When traveling always keep your doors locked



Reminder.....

One of the amenities of Atlantis is back door garbage service. We pay a premium for the garbage company to pick up the garbage from the underground cans. This keeps the city looking neat and clean.

Please place your items in the underground cans **before 7:00 am on Monday and Thursday**. Bulk items may be placed at the curb on Sunday night for collection on Monday.

Vegetation may be placed at the curb on Sunday night as well. If you use a contract lawn maintenance company, that company is required to take all debris away with them on the day it is generated.

Paying Your Utility Bill Has Never Been Easier!!

Option 1. We still take cash and checks!! Bring or mail your payment to City Hall 260 Orange Tree Drive, Atlantis Florida 33462. There is also a drop box in the rear parking lot at City Hall for drive up drop off of your payment.

Option 2. The City takes credit cards for the payment of the utilities bill and other city charges. In order to pay your bill via credit card, follow these simple steps:

Click on "City Government"

Click on "Utilities"

Click on "Online Utility Payments"

Click on "Pay Utility Bills"

Fill in required information on the form and submit, make sure you include your Utilities Service Address. You will receive an email confirmation.

Option 3. Auto Draft Services- No postage, No late charges, No checks to write!

The City of Atlantis Utilities provides customers with the convenience of Auto Pay for their Utility Bills. By providing us with your bank information, the City is able to automatically deduct your utilities payments from your account. You may sign up for this service at any time.

Q. How do I sign up for Auto Draft Services?

A. Complete the authorization form and send it, or drop it off at City Hall.

We are located at 260 Orange Tree Drive, Atlantis, Florida 33462.

Q. How will my bill be paid?

A. On the fifth of the month following the bill date, your account will be debited for the amount of your bill.

Q. Do I have to bank with a certain bank?

A. Your financial institution must be able to access the Federal Reserve Automated Clearing House (ACH). Most U.S. Financial institutions have access to this network. Payments must be made in US Funds.

Please complete this form and return it along with a voided check.

I authorize the City of Atlantis to instruct my bank/savings institution to make my utility payments from the account listed below. I understand that I control my payments and at any time I wish to discontinue this service, I will notify the City of Atlantis Utilities.
