POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS.....By Chief Robert G. Mangold***Community Safety through Community Awareness and Involvement:
Crime Prevention Tip:***

Last month general information was presented about home burglaries; this month we are continuing with information about how best to secure your doors.

The first step is to *harden the target* or make your home more difficult to enter. Remember, the burglar will simply bypass your home if it requires too much effort or requires more skill and tools than they possess. Most burglars enter via the front, back, or garage doors. Experienced burglars know that the garage door is usually the weakest point of entry followed by the back door. The garage and back doors also provide the most cover. Burglars know to look inside your car for keys and other valuables so keep it locked, even when parked inside your garage. Use high quality Grade-1 or Grade-2 locks on exterior doors to resist twisting, prying, and lock-picking attempts. A quality deadbolt lock will have a beveled casing to inhibit the use of channel-lock pliers used to shear off lock cylinder pins. A quality door knob-in-lock set will have a 'dead latch' mechanism to prevent slipping the lock with a shim or credit card.

- Use a solid core or metal door for all entrance points
- Use a quality, heavy-duty, deadbolt lock with a one-inch throw bolt
- Use a quality, heavy-duty, knob-in-lock set with a dead-latch mechanism
- Use a heavy-duty, four-screw, strike plate with 3-inch screws to penetrate into a wooden door frame
- Use a wide-angle 160° peephole mounted no higher than 58 inches

The most common way used to force entry through a door with a wooden jamb is to simply kick it open. The weakest point is almost always the lock strike plate that holds the latch or lock bolt in place followed by a glass paneled door. The average door strike plate is secured only by the soft-wood doorjamb molding. These lightweight moldings are often tacked on to the door frame and can be torn away with a firm kick. Because of this construction flaw, it makes sense to upgrade to a four-screw, heavy-duty, high security strike plate. They are available in most quality hardware stores and home improvement centers and are definitely worth the extra expense. Install this heavy-duty strike plate using 3-inch wood screws to cut deep into the door frame stud. Use these longer screws in the knob lock strike plate as well and use at least one long screw in each door hinge. This one step alone will deter or prevent most through-the-door forced entries. You and your family will sleep safer in the future.

In January's newsletter we will continue with home burglary and how to secure sliding glass doors and windows.

Holiday Shopping and Safety:

The police department wants to remind everyone that this is the season for crimes of opportunity, such as purse snatching and car burglaries. Citizens need to exercise extra care when shopping and carrying armloads of packages to parked cars:

- do not shop alone and avoid shopping at night
- avoid carrying large sums of money, use credit/debit cards to shop
- when approaching or leaving your vehicle be aware of your surroundings and observant of others in your immediate vicinity
- lock your vehicle when you park it, and if you must shop at night, park in a well lighted area and be prepared to enter your vehicle without having to rummage for your car keys
- Ask mall or store security for an escort if there is any suspicious activity near your vehicle
- do not leave valuables in plain sight in unoccupied vehicles
- when traveling always keep your doors locked

Kintz Park Use Policy

Due to the increasing operating costs associated with the ever increasing number of private parties at Kintz Park it is necessary to initiate some guidelines for events at the park. We are also limiting the days that the park is available for private events so as to make the park available to families for casual play. So, from hereafter the following fees and rules will be in effect governing the use of Kintz Park. A permit will be issued. The party host must bring the permit to the police department with identification the day of the event to obtain access to the facilities.

- New Fee for resident use of \$100 for Friday, Saturday and Sunday. This is in addition to the current \$50 cleaning deposit. A \$50 cleaning deposit is required for Monday-Thursday reservations.
- Non-Resident Use Fee remains at \$400. We have a revised form and requirements. The address of the party host will be used to determine the fee to be paid.
- One reservation per available day with a maximum of six (6) hours per reservation.
- No reservations will be accepted for the second and fourth Sundays of each month.
- No reservations will be permitted for New Year's Day, Easter, Memorial Day, July 4, Labor Day, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.
- Application must be made in person by the party host. A permit will be issued once the application is approved and the fee is paid. Information on outside vendors must be fully disclosed and insurance certificates provided.
- Any rides or amusements brought into the Park must be registered and provide proper insurance with the City of Atlantis named as an additional insured. No animals are allowed in the park. Failure to provide insurance certificates will result in the prohibition of the use of such facilities the day of the party. The certificate of insurance will be attached to the permit.
- Vehicles will not be allowed in the park for safety reasons. You may have your vehicle in the park for loading and unloading; however, it must be legally parked outside of the park for the duration of the party. Guest vehicles must be legally parked for the duration of the party. Refrain from parking on lawns or driveways of the neighboring residences. The police officers on duty will assist in ensuring the safety of the guests and the community.
- Groups of 8 or more with a single host using the park and/or anyone wishing to use the building must make a reservation and pay the fee.

The Palm Beach County Property Appraiser's Office will be accepting Homestead Exemption applications from residents. (All Palm Beach County residents are welcome)

When: The 4th Wednesday of each month, now through December 29, 2010. Time: 11:00 am to noon.

A copy of your deed and proof of residency is required.
