ATLANTIS CITY COUNCIL NEWS:

The Organizational Meeting was called to Order at 7:15 pm on March 18, 2009.

Resolution No. 09-07, appointing certain officers, passed 5-0. This involved the Architectural Review Committee, the Board of Adjustment and the Police Pension Board.

Oath of Office was given to Treasurer Michael C. Dahlgren and Mayor Manny Fernandez. They both qualified for their seats. Congratulations!

City Council meeting followed.

Ordinance No. 408-Amending the City's Comprehensive Development Plan to Adopt Annual Capital Improvement Update passed 5-0 upon second and final reading. This was required by Florida Statutes.

Resolution 09-08 supporting House Bill 189 and Senate Bill 922 regarding specific breeds of dangerous dogs, passed 5-0. If these bills pass, it will give

Atlantis and other municipalities the power to decide what is right for them rather than having to blindly follow State law regarding animal control.

In Miscellaneous Business, the Mayor read a Proclamation on the 50th Anniversary of the City of Atlantis on April 4, 2009. The Mayor also proclaimed April as Water Conservation Month to protect Florida water resources.

As Atlantis celebrates its 50th anniversary as a top municipality in Palm Beach County, it has much to be proud of as we reflect back on all the accomplishments that have transpired to make Atlantis what it is today. Atlantis is the gem of Palm Beach County!

Crime Prevention Tip:

**Social Security Recipients Warned of Scams
Beware of persons posing as Social Security employees**

The Social Security Administration (SSA) is warning benefit recipients that they are currently the targets of a number of scams surfacing throughout the United States.

Jo Anne Barnhart, Commissioner of Social Security and Patrick O'Carroll, Jr., Acting Inspector General of Social Security reported that SSA had received numerous reports about telephone calls or visits from people alleging to be Social Security employees. In each case, the person attempted to obtain personal information, such as a Social Security or bank account number, from the Social Security recipient.

The perpetrators, who identify themselves as Social Security employees, have used a variety of tactics to obtain personal information. In one instance, the caller said the Agency was experiencing a power outage and needed to verify the person's information. In another, the caller posed as an employee who needed to verify the recipient's direct deposit information.

In a third, the recipient is told their Social Security benefits are being cut because they have inherited a house from a relative; an event that would not result in a reduction of their Social Security benefit according to Commissioner Barnhart.

To help perpetrate the fraud, the caller then places the recipient on hold and plays the same on-hold recordings used by Social Security. When the caller gets back on the line, the recipient is then told proceeds from the sale of the house will be sent to them if they pay the back taxes.

Acting Inspector General O'Carroll recommends people always take precautions when giving out personal information. "You should never provide your Social Security number or other personal information over the telephone unless you initiated the contact, or are confident of the person to whom you are speaking," O'Carroll said. "If in doubt, do not release information without first verifying the validity of the call." Barnhart and O'Carroll recommend contacting the [local Social Security office](#) or Social Security's toll-free number at 1-800-772-1213 to verify the legitimacy of the call. (If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call Social Security's TTY number at 1-800-325-0778.)

Acting Inspector General O'Carroll notes that the Office of Inspector General (OIG) is working closely with the Agency to investigate all reports of suspicious activity. To report suspicious activity, please call the OIG Hotline at 1-800-269-0271. (If you are deaf or hard of hearing, call the OIG TTY number at 1-866-501-2101.)
