**City News...**

The City of Atlantis Local Planning Agency began at 7:00 pm on March 21, 2012.

Ordinance 419 was recommended 5-0 to amend Chapter 4 of our Building Codes. This updates the Florida Building Code, The Standard Housing Code, and The National Electrical Code and will adopt local amendments to Chapter 1 of the Florida Building Code. It also repeals certain obsolete technical building code amendments.

Immediately following the LPA Meeting, was the Organizational Meeting. Oath of Office was given to incumbents Fred Furtado, Catherine Higgins and David Kintz. Resolution 12-03, a resolution appointing certain officers passed 5-0.

The Atlantis Council Meeting started immediately following the Organizational Meeting.

Ordinance 419 Amending Chapter 4, Building Codes passed 5-0 upon its final reading.

Ordinance 420, Amending Chapter 9, Business Tax Receipts, assuring that Atlantis can legally receive a 5% increase every other year passed 5-0 upon first reading.

Also passing 5-0 upon first reading was Ordinance 421. This Ordinance amends Chapter 8 of the

Flood Hazard Prevention and is necessary for our participation in the National Flood Insurance Program.

Resolution 12-04, a resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with Grizzly's Wild Animal Service passed 5-0. This is a renewal of our existing contract.

Resolution 12-05, a resolution placing liens for unpaid water and or sewer charges on certain properties served by our Utilities Department passed 5-0.

Also passing 5-0 was Resolution 12-06, a resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with TV Diversified for the construction of the Master Lift Station. The cost of this project will be partially covered by grants.

In Miscellaneous Business Southern Waste Systems was present to discuss the upcoming contract renewal. The plans for renovating the Kintz Park building will be discussed further at a workshop.

Treasurer Manny Fernandez reported that Atlantis is in fine financial shape and suggested we do nothing to jeopardize our good position. Council voted 5-0 to shut down the water fountain at our main entrance lakes on Clubhouse Blvd. until the problem of spraying on the residents homes can be resolved due to wind situations.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS.....BY CHIEF ROBERT G. MANGOLD****Crime Prevention Tip: Identity Theft Facts: Fastest Growing Crime Worldwide****Preventive Steps**

- Run a credit report on yourself to see if there are any unknown credit inquiries or unauthorized accounts
- Reconcile your check and credit card statements in a timely fashion and challenge any purchases that you did not make
- Limit the number of credit cards you have to reduce exposure, and cancel any inactive accounts
- Destroy all unused pre-approved credit card and loan applications. The mailbox thief only has to fill them out and redirect the return address to start using your credit
- Never give any important number out like from your drivers' license, credit card, bank account, date of birth or social security number to anyone you don't know over the telephone
- Minimize exposure of your drivers' license number, date of birth, social security number, and credit card numbers. If the numbers are requested for check cashing purposes, ask if the business has alternative options such as such as using a check-cashing card
- Safeguard your credit, debit, and ATM card receipts and shred them before disposing of them
- Shred your bank statements and any tax documents when you dispose of them
- Before disposal, shred paycheck stubs and W-2 forms that contain your social security number and often your name and address. This is a common way for dumpster divers to obtain important identification
- Scrutinize your utility and subscription bills to make sure the charges are yours
- Destroy all checks immediately when you close a checking account. Destroy or keep in a secure place, any courtesy checks that your bank or credit card company may mail to you
- Memorize your passwords and personal identification (PIN) numbers. Keep your PIN numbers somewhere that only you know
- Don't give out your PIN or write them on your credit cards or ATM cards
- Keep a list or photocopy all credit and identification cards you carry with you, including front and back, so that you can quickly call the issuers to inform them about missing or stolen cards
- Don't give away too much personal information on your family web site. Full names, date of births, and address is too much information to post. By obtaining your "place-of-birth," the identity thief can possibly get your duplicate birth certificate
- Protect your mother's maiden name, especially when using family tree tracers and genealogy service web sites. Maiden names are often used as passwords to access accounts over the telephone
- Never leave your purse or wallet unattended, at work, at restaurants, at health fitness clubs, in your shopping cart, at church or at social gatherings. Never leave your purse or wallet in open view in your car, even when locked

**If You Become a Victim**

- Report the incident to the police immediately. If you know where your identification was stolen, that would be the correct police jurisdiction to report it to. Insist on being given a police report number and get a copy to enclose in correspondence with credit agencies.
- Report all stolen cards to the issuers immediately and request new card numbers. Always respond to written credit card receipt notifications received in the mail
- Notify your bank in the event that your checks are stolen and request that your account be closed
- In order to prove your innocence, be prepared to fill out affidavits of forgeries for banks, credit grantors, and recipients of stolen checks. They are joint victims with you and may suffer a financial loss
- Be prepared to work with retailers who have been victimized by someone using your name to help mitigate their losses, if necessary
- If you know the abuser, report them to the Federal Trade Commission
- Go online to social security administration if someone is using your social security number to establish credit or new accounts. If SSN fraud is suspected, call the SSA Hotline: (800) 772-1213
- Obtain copies of your credit report periodically to see if there are any unknown credit lines in your name. All three major credit reporting agencies in the United States have toll free telephone numbers. Equifax (888) 532-0179; Experian (800) 311-4769; Trans Union (800) 680-7289. Each agency has a consumer fraud division. Call them.
- Report suspected fraud to the credit reporting agencies and request that your account be red flagged with a fraud statement posted at the top of your report to all three credit reporting agencies. This will stop future credit from being issued until you are contacted and will remain in place for seven years or until you cancel the request. These agencies will also help clear up negative information on the reports due to fraud.

### Wrist bands go on Sale at City Hall on April 2!



## Special events at Spring Fling...



Meet the designer of Sunset Park—Collene Walter! Collene and her husband Lindsey have lived in Atlantis for 16 years. With a degree in Landscape Architecture, as well as a Masters Degree in Urban and Regional Planning, Collene has worked on both residential and commercial master plans in several local communities. She is a principal at Urban Design Kilday Studios, located in West Palm Beach.

Prior to designing Sunset Park, Collene and her firm did all the planting along the west wall of Atlantis (Military Trail) and the landscaping around the fountain at the main entrance to the city. She loved Kintz Park, but didn't realize there was such a large underutilized space at the west gate. So she started working with the City Manager and City Council to create a park with beautiful plants to enjoy during "passive" recreation, like walking the Heart Trail. She donated her time and talents to the city, and the park was dedicated in 2009.

During her talk and tour of Sunset Park at Spring Fling, starting at 10:30, Collene will share her inspiration for the design of the Butterfly Garden. She'll talk about how the different plants and flowers support the life cycle of butterflies, pointing out how the landscape changes throughout the year. She also hopes residents will get some ideas for their own gardens and property, using mostly low maintenance varieties of trees, shrubs and flowers. It should be a lot of fun!



Mayor Michael Dahlgren will also be at Sunset Park to kick off the Garden Tour. He plans to talk about the white fly, downy mildew problems that have affected ficus trees, and impatiens plants throughout the city. Mike spent his career in the agricultural seed and nursery businesses, so he's well qualified to talk about these topics, answer your questions, and provide informational sources to you. Stop by to hear what he has to say!

### **Hurricane shutters regulations (4-61a 8) are as follows:**

All permanently attached components of storm panel systems shall match the color of the walls or trim of the building. Storm shutters which are installed, hung, attached to a structure or are otherwise utilized for their intended purpose for any period of time in excess of thirty (30) consecutive days must be manufactured, painted or treated so that they match or complement the structure to which they are attached, subject to the following:

- a) Corrugated aluminum or other metallic shutters need not be painted, but must be properly maintained and uniform in appearance on the structure to which they are attached subject to the time limits set forth in subsection d. Below.
- b) The use of wood is permitted so long as the wood that is installed, hung, attached to a structure or used as storm shutters for a period of time in excess of thirty (30) consecutive days is painted to match the color of the walls or trim of the building, subject to the time limits set forth in subsection d. below.
- c) Due to the nature of being permanently attached to the building even when in the open position, all components of accordion and roll up shutters shall match the color of the walls or trim of the building.
- d) Under no circumstances shall wood or metal panels be installed prior to June 1 nor shall they be allowed to remain in place after November 30 of any year, unless a hurricane "warning" or "watch" has been issued outside of such time frame, in which case the said panels are allowed but must be removed within two (2) weeks of the end of the storm event.

Call the Police Department and ask to go on the "Dark List." They will ask you for contact information and a local contact in case there is an issue on your property while you are away. Homes on the "Dark List" are checked periodically while the owners are away.


