

**Manager's Notes January 2012**

2011 is coming to a close so I will take this opportunity to do a year in review. We have had a good 2011 in the city. As always our community events were well attended. We again had Peter Johnke at the Spring Fling. We had a wonderful buffet dinner followed by fireworks. The Fall Festival and Green Market was well attended with numerous vendors selling their goods. As always, our signature event is the Holiday on Wheels Golf Cart Parade, covered elsewhere in this newsletter. The 19th one was a big success. The 20th anniversary will be in 2012 so we will be looking for ways to make that extra special.

The City Council has had a busy year. The City Council passed several ordinances and over 25 resolutions. The Council deliberated and debated the Pain Management Clinic issue. A moratorium was issued while an ad hoc committee researched the problems and recommended a solution. The new legislation will assist in regulating our local businesses engaged in this practice.

Resolutions included routine contracts for services, the overlay of North Country Club Drive and Villa Drive North and other projects. We undertook an energy saving project at the Splash Pad in Kintz Park. The savings that will result from tying the drainage into a lake will pay for the project in a short time. A new franchise agreement with Florida Power and Light will bring revenue to the city for the next 30 years. Council's work also included an agreement with JFK Medical Center to share in the cost of a new Master Lift Station. We will replace the Master Station in 2012. Some of the funding will be provided through this agreement, some through grant funding and the balance from other utility revenue. The municipal complex was fitted with new energy efficient impact windows during 2011 through an energy grant from the County. And finally, as I said last month the Police Department had a long awaited technology upgrade to the radio system and the 911 equipment.

Last month we were provided the wrong web site address for the energy rebate program. It is Energy2Save.net (not .com.), or call 1-888-283-7720. Please note that Atlantis is not offering the roof coating rebate. Applications will be processed on a first come, first served basis. Details are elsewhere in the newsletter.

My daughter Nicole and I are looking forward to a better 2012. As mentioned by the Mayor, I lost my husband right before the holidays. He had been ill for quite a long time. I would like to thank everyone in my Atlantis family for their kindness and support to the Thornton family at this difficult time.

**Police Department: A Year in Review**

As 2011 comes to a close we are looking back over an active year. The Police Department responded to over 5,000 calls for service. Some of these were as simple as a dark house cancellation or as routine as a traffic stop. Others were more complex involving major crimes and multi-jurisdictional investigations. Some of the cases closed by our detective, Marvin Jenne are summarized below.

**IDENTITY THEFT/ FRAUD** - In September of 2008 a burglary to a vehicle occurred in the parking lot of JFK Medical Center. The suspects used credit cards stolen from the burglary to purchase parts for their car. A female involved in the theft used a stolen credit card to enroll in a driver's course so she could obtain her Florida Drivers License. One suspect was apprehended in August 2011 and pled guilty to Fraud and Grand Theft. Her co-defendant was arrested for Fraud and Grand Theft in January of 2011 and later pled guilty.

**GRAND THEFT-** In November of 2010 the owners of Rosalita's Restaurant reported that an employee had been stealing from the restaurant. A second employee was later identified as a co-conspirator and agreed to make restitution in the amount of \$9,000 and testify against the main perpetrator. After reviewing and analyzing more than 5,000 pages of business records, a warrant was issued for the employee charging Grand Theft over \$ 20,000, a 1<sup>st</sup> degree felony. He confessed to the theft and his case is pending. A plea has been discussed in which he will plead guilty and pay \$50,000 in restitution to Rosalita's.

**NARCOTICS-** In January, officers assisted agents from the PB County Sheriff's Office and the Postal Inspector's office who intercepted a package containing 8 pounds of marijuana scheduled for delivery to a physician's office on JFK Drive. Another 7 pounds of marijuana was seized from the car of the suspect's boyfriend who came to pick up the delivery. The medical office employee, a receptionist, and her boyfriend cooperated with agents in identifying the source of the drugs imported from Mexico to California.

**FRAUD/IDENTITY THEFT/GRAND THEFT-**

1. In March, a black male presented a counterfeit Florida driver's license along with a counterfeit bank card and check to a teller at Bank of America. The teller became suspicious of the customer who fled the bank leaving behind the counterfeit driver's license. Using Facial Recognition technology, the suspect was identified. He is currently in the Broward County Jail awaiting extradition to Palm Beach County to face charges in our case.
2. In June, a complaint was received that a person's name, DOB, Social Security Number and address were used to obtain medical services from JFK Medical Center. The person was arrested for Grand Theft, and Fraud and Falsely Obtaining Medical Services from a Medical Provider. He has pleaded guilty and placed on probation. A civil restitution order was obtained on behalf of JFK Medical Center requiring him to pay \$1,300 for services rendered.
3. In July, officers responded to a call of a fraud in progress at Bank of America. The suspect vehicle fled the scene and was stopped at Orange Tree and Clubhouse Blvd. A white female and two black males fled the vehicle. The white female was arrested a short time later and booked into the PB County Jail. The follow-up investigation revealed that the woman, who lives in Orlando, is a part of a multi-state fraud ring working out of South Florida. She has been connected to more than 45 cases in Florida as well as cases in Illinois, Wisconsin and elsewhere. APD has provided intelligence information to agencies in several other jurisdictions leading to charges being filed. This case is likely to be assigned to a State Wide Prosecutor due to the many law enforcement jurisdictions involved.

#### Community Safety through Community Awareness and Involvement:

#### Crime Prevention Tip: Security Planning for Families

Last month's newsletter provided information about "Home Security for the Christmas Holidays and Holiday Shopping and Safety;" this month we will continue with "**Parking Lot Security and Property Crime.**"

**Parking lots** come in all shapes and sizes from the gigantic high-rise or subterranean multi-level structures to the flat lots of a small retail strip-center with only a few stores. While parking lots provide a great service by allowing us access to retail and office centers, they sometimes create a substantial risk. What determines the relative safety of a parking area are governed by three factors. They are 1) the nature of the parking lot, 2) the crime history, and 3) the location.

#### Nature of a Parking Lot

A parking lot is best described by the design and how and when it is used. The crime rate of a parking lot can be affected positively or negatively by its' design. Large high-rise or subterranean structures can have poor visibility because of walls, pillars, and elevation changes. Large flat parking lots attached to a regional mall can offer a car-thief great visibility to watch for security and great escape routes. The time of day, traffic, and the use of the parking lot makes a difference to its' relative safety. As you can imagine, late at night some parking lots can become remote with no available witnesses to watch over the area. A parking lot outside of a nightclub will have different problems than a lot adjacent to a day-use only professional office building. At nighttime, lighting is an important condition that allows us to see potential threats and thereby deters some criminals. You should be able to see and identify someone at 100 feet. If lighting is inadequate, park somewhere else.

#### Property Crime

The most common crime in parking lots is theft or vandalism. Where else can you find such a selection of automobiles left unattended--it's a thief's dream. The most frequent crimes are auto vandalism and auto burglary. Thieves think nothing about smashing out your car window to steal a stereo, a portable telephone, or some item left on the seat. What they need is a little time and no witnesses. Some parking lots are notorious for auto thefts and auto burglaries. Sometimes the explanation is that they are located adjacent to excellent escape routes such as freeway on-ramps or major high-speed thoroughfares. Flat parking lots are preferable to thieves because of ease of visibility and ease of escape. Multi-level pay lots offer some deterrence because of the access control and the requirement to pass the video-monitored toll booth upon exit. Valet parking is considered safer because the attendant goes out into the lot for you to retrieve your car. Another benefit is that unauthorized persons stand out in this special parking area that is supposed to be accessed by attendants only. If you are a woman alone, consider using valet parking at hotels and where available, especially at night.

**Remember these parking lot security tips:**

- Park only in a well-lighted and a highly-visible location
- If you cannot see 100 feet at night, park elsewhere
- Park in higher traffic areas of the lot, if possible
- Move your car during the day to improve its' location
- Remove all interior valuables from plain view
- Lock your doors and roll up all windows
- Use a highly-visible steering wheel or brake pedal locking device
- Use a car alarm and alarm decals, if possible

Use valet parking for greater personal security, if available

**Traffic Safety:** The intersection where North Country Club Drive, Walton Heath Drive, and Glenbrook Drive meet is a four way stop. This intersection can be dangerous due to traffic coming from four different directions, and in fact was recently the scene of a vehicle vs. bicyclist accident. Per Florida State Statutes motorists and bicyclists must come to a complete stop and ensure that the intersection is clear before proceeding through the intersection.

The intersection of North Country Club Drive and North Country Club Blvd. has also been problematic. People entering the city from Military Trail are assuming motorists southbound on North Country Club Drive approaching North Country Club Blvd. are going to turn on to North Country Club Blvd. to the exit city. Because of this assumption these drivers are pulling out on to North Country Club Drive and almost causing accidents. Motorists must not assume the intent of other motorists, again, come to a complete stop and ensure that the traffic way is clear before entering it.
