## THE MAYOR'S CORNER

Dear Residents,

I certainly hope that the Flu season has not caught up to you. With the new strain of H1N1, it is ever so important for all of us to get both, a regular flu shot plus the new vaccine for the H1N1 (Swine Flu) virus. Regular flu shots are already widely available, and it is anticipated that the H1N1 vaccine will be available in our area mid-October. Please get yours.

Our first annual Fall Festival was a huge success. It began with a dedication of the newly created west park quarter mile Heart Trail, where a ribbon cutting ceremony culminated in the release of thousands of environmentally- friendly ladybugs. Next, over 100 bicyclists of all ages began a 10-mile course through the city and finished at Kintz Park. Once they arrived there, they were greeted with refreshments, entertainment, and a green market. With an attendance of several hundred residents and guests, this event reminded me of the citizenship and good spirit enjoyed during our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration held earlier this year. My recommendation, for those of you that did not attend this year, is to ensure that you do next year. I am certain that we will build on the success of this event to make next year's even better.

The final tax news for the season is that we have delivered a budget that funds all services currently enjoyed by our residents with nearly the same dollars as last year. Essentially, as a result of our city staff and utilities operations forgoing any increases in compensation, in addition to extensive pencil sharpening by our city manager, a tax increase has been averted. Good news, Yes. Painless, No. As you may remember, last year's budget preparation was "eventful". With the passing of Amendment 1, we found it difficult to see a positive way out of a difficult situation, yet we did. This year, with the continued uncertainty of the real estate market, overall values dropped again and we were negatively affected in tax calculations. The reason for saying this is that I want to assure you that your city council, along with the great efforts and sacrifices of the City Staff, have once again acted prudently and in your best interest. Despite having less to work with, we continue to do great things with the available resources, but as this next tax year passes, we anticipate property valuations to increase so that further operational sacrifices are avoided.

**ATLANTIS CITY COUNCIL NEWS**

The City of Atlantis Final Budget hearing was held at 7 pm on September 16, 2009.

Resolution 09-30, adopting the final Millage Rate of 6.60 for 2009-2010, passed 3-0. This is .34% under the rolled back rate of 6.6226 necessary to fund the budget.

Resolution 09-31, adopting the budget for fiscal year 2009-2010, also passed 3-0. Treasurer Michael Dahlgren pointed out that every department willingly took cuts so as to stay within the new budget guidelines so there will not be cuts to services. Councilmember Higgins stated that the city is taking in 330,000 few dollars this year so we had to budget accordingly. Thanks to all of the City Staff and Council Members, Atlantis has succeeded on a sound basis once again.

The City Council Meeting followed the Budget Hearing.

Resolution 09-32, a Resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with A-Plus Home Health Care for flu shots, passed 3-0.

Resolution 09-33, a Resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with JFK Medical Center for emergency room security with our Police Department passed 3-0.

Resolution 09-34, passed 3-0. This resolution adopts an updated comprehensive fee schedule for Atlantis.

Treasurer Michael Dahlgren stated that over 1,000 feet of sewer lines have been relined so as to stop water infiltration and therefore save the city future expenses. Councilmember Cathy Higgins explained about the Heart Walk to be held on September 26, 2009 and chaired by our very own Richard Brown.

The Fall Festival will be held on October 3, 2009.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS by Chief Robert G. Mangold**

**Crime Prevention:** For years, The Better Business Bureau has educated consumers about not giving out personal information over the telephone or to anyone who shows up at their front door. With the U.S. Census process beginning, BBB advises people to be cooperative, but cautious, so as not to become a victim of fraud or identity theft.

The first phase of the 2010 U.S. Census is under way as workers have begun verifying the addresses of households across the country. Eventually, more than 140,000 U.S. Census workers will count every person in the United States and will gather information about every person living at each address including name, age, gender, race and other relevant data.

“Most people are rightfully cautious and won’t give out personal information to unsolicited phone callers or visitors, however the Census is an exception to the rule,” said Steve Cox, BBB spokesperson. “Unfortunately, scammers know that the public is more willing to share personal data when taking part in the Census and they have an opportunity to ply their trade by posing as a government employee and soliciting sensitive financial information.”

The Census data will be used to allocate more than \$300 billion in federal funds every year, as well as determine a State’s number of Congressional representatives. Households are actually required by law to respond to the Census Bureau’s request for information.

During the U.S. Census, households will be contacted by mail, telephone or visited by a U.S. Census worker who will inquire about the number of people living in the house. Unfortunately, people may also be contacted by scammers who are impersonating Census workers in order to gain access to sensitive financial information such as Social Security, bank account or credit card numbers. Law enforcement in several states have issued warnings that scammers are already posing as Census Bureau employees and knocking on doors asking for donations and Social Security numbers.

The big question is - how do you tell the difference between a U.S. Census worker and a con artist? BBB offers the following advice:

- If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, they will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag and a confidentiality notice. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. However, you should never invite anyone you don’t know into your home.
- Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to verify address information. Do not give your Social Security number, credit card or banking information to anyone, even if they claim they need it for the U.S. Census. While the Census Bureau might ask for basic financial information, such as a salary range, it will not ask for Social Security, bank account or credit card numbers nor will employees solicit donations.
- Eventually, Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail or in person at home. However, they will not contact you by e-mail, so be on the look out for e-mail scams impersonating the Census. Never click on a link or open any attachments in an e-mail that are supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.

**Pedestrian Safety:** While pedestrians are advised to carry lights at night when walking, jogging, etc., they must take care not to blind oncoming motorists by shining the lights into the driver’s eyes.

Pedestrians should also move off the roadway when emergency vehicles are responding to an emergency with lights and siren activated.

Resident **Collene Walter** for developing the plan for the park.


Councilman **Mike Dahlgren, Bill Boyd, and Richard Brown**—for their work as the Landscape Committee.


**Bill Boyd** and Boyd Nurseries for donating the trees.

**A-Plus will be administering the Flu and Pneumococcal Shots.** The Flu vaccine is available to anyone older than 6 months and the pneumococcal vaccine to anyone older than 13 years of age.

**IMPORTANT Billing Information:**

**Anyone receiving a vaccine must present a valid form of Identification.**

**Medicare Recipients must provide their Medicare ID**

**A-Plus will bill Medicare directly,** with no co payment or deductible. Medicare ***MUST*** be your primary insurance company; they will not pay if you have another insurance company. You must pay A-Plus and then submit a receipt to your insurance company to get reimbursed. **A-Plus is unable to bill any other insurance companies.**

**Non-Medicare recipients will be charged \$30.00 for Flu and \$45.00 for Pneumococcal vaccines.**

**First come first serve, from 9 AM—4:30 PM**

**Forms are available at City Hall** for anyone who wishes to fill them out prior to the clinic.



Curbside items may only be placed at the curb after 5:00 pm on the day before collection. \*Exception, on the first Sunday of each month items may be placed at the curb after noon for Monday pickup.

Please use your underground containers. Liners may be obtained at Ace Hardware or by calling Jim Schumacher at 718-5888 for liners or other repairs. Recycle containers may be obtained at City Hall.

Landscape debris generated by a paid landscape maintenance company must be removed on the day of generation by the maintenance company. (City of Atlantis Code of Ordinances 8.3-9)
