CITY COUNCIL MEETING

MINUTES

Mayor Kintz called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

Present were: Mayor David Kintz, Vice Mayor Catherine Higgins, Councilmember Manny Fernandez, Councilmember Fred Furtado, City Manager Mo Thornton, City Attorney Trela White. Mayor Pro Tem Michael Dahlgren was absent.

In Miscellaneous Business: Jon Schmidt of Jon E. Schmidt and Associates presented a request for annexation and land use proposal for the property at 4960 S. Military Trail. He answered questions from the Council. Ms. Thornton read an e-mail from Mayor Pro Tem Dahlgren supporting the annexation. The Council agreed by consensus to bring forward an ordinance for annexation at the January meeting.

Mayor Kintz read a Proclamation naming January as Stalking Awareness Month.

Mayor Kintz asked for comments from the public. There were none.

Ms. Thornton gave the League of Cities Report: Atlantis hosted the Legislative Roundtable at the Atlantis Country Club that afternoon. The next General Membership meeting is in January. In the City Manager's report, the fence along Congress Ave. is complete, to be followed by irrigation and landscaping. The Golf Cart Parade was one of the best ever; next year's date is December 14th. The Salvation Army is the recipient of the food and toy donations at the event. The city has received a preliminary report from GAI on the storm water utility study; they would like to present their report in early January. The field work for the audit is complete. The timing of the audit presentation depends on when the actuary information is received. She read an e-mail from Mayor Pro Tem Dahlgren thanking everyone for the golf cart parade and wishing everyone a Merry Christmas. She wished everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

Chief Mangold gave the crime report for November.

Attorney White reported that the County had voted to keep its membership with the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council. She wished everyone a happy holiday season.

Mayor Kintz asked for comments from Council:

Council Member Furtado complimented Mr. Schmidt on an article he wrote for the Palm Beach Post. He wished everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

Treasurer Fernandez reported that taxes are starting to be paid. The city's expenditures are on the mark. The utility fund will be more predictable going forward. He wished everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

Vice Mayor Higgins reported that there will be an improvement this year in town maintenance. She thanked the city's staff for their work this year and said she's enjoyed working with the Council. She wished everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

Mayor Kintz commented on the golf cart parade and home decorating contest and thanked the staff for their efforts. He wished everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.
