Manager's Notes December 2011

As 2011 is coming to a close the Atlantis Police Department is completing some technology projects that have been a long time in the making. Today, the officers go live on the new radio system. Congratulations to Chief Bob Mangold! He persevered with this project when it did not seem that it would happen. He has been working with the Public Safety Radio Consortium for the past 10 years to bring this improvement to Atlantis. The new radio system enhances officer safety by providing interoperability between our agency and others. Coverage for our officers has been expanded county-wide. Funds for this project were set aside several years ago in anticipation of this vast improvement in communications.

Our new 911 equipment arrived this week as well. At this time our dispatch equipment is being upgraded to the latest technology. This project is paid for by Palm Beach County through funds collected on local phone bills. Repairs and adjustments have been made to the gate camera system. The system is fully functional bringing an enhancement to our perimeter security.

Please take the time to stop by and pick up your 2012 auto decals. Our decal program is one of the cornerstones of our community policing. By issuing decals on an annual basis, the Police and Security Guards can better monitor all vehicular traffic entering the City. Your participation in the program is critical to its success. Decals will be available beginning on January 3, 2012. They can be picked up at any time from the police dispatcher.

Perhaps you have noticed the vacant lot on South Country Club Drive that has been turned into a 'native forest.' With the help of Barbara Kreisman, Shirley Bainbridge allowed her lot to be transformed into a native Florida habitat. Thank you so much for beautifying our city.

If you get a chance, stop by the City Council Chambers to view the beautiful photograph done by Aaron Rinker of the City's entrance. We have so many wonderful and talented residents. Have a very happy and safe holiday season.

City News...

The City of Atlantis Council meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on November 16th.

Resolution 11-25, a resolution authorizing the mayor to sign an agreement with Command Security, passed 3-1. This renews the city's agreement for gatehouse security for an additional year.

Resolution 11-26 passed 4-0. This resolution grants a utility easement to Florida Power and Light Company, for the purpose of placing and maintaining an electric transformer or other public utility purposes.

Resolution 11-27 was discussed and passed 3-1. This resolution adopts Atlantis City Council Policy 2011-1, regarding the Legal Defense and Indemnification of City of Atlantis Employee and Elected Officials, Officers, Board and Council Members. This sets the

City's policy and procedures for providing a legal defense for officials and employees who are forced to defend against legal action that arises out of the scope and course of their city related duties and responsibilities.

The Annual Golf Cart Parade will take place on December 12th.

POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS by Chief Robert G. Mangold**Community Safety through Community Awareness and Involvement:****Crime Prevention Tip: Family Security and Safety Tips**

Last month's newsletter provided information about "Carjacking Facts and Advice"; this month we will continue with two sets of tips, "**Home Security for the Christmas Holidays and Holiday Shopping and Safety.**"

Christmas holidays are a special time when families and friends come together to celebrate the season. It is also the time of year where families and friends are most generous and practice the tradition of gift giving. It should be a joyous and happy time for all of us.

Unfortunately for us, home burglars view the holiday season a little differently. For them, it is a time of opportunity to burglarize your home for cash, credit cards, and all the new gifts of small electronics, computers, jewelry, and easily sold valuables.

Here are a few tips of what they look for when shopping for a house to burglarize. These tips will help you enjoy the holidays without incident.

- Burglars look for an easy entry with good escape routes. Don't openly display your Christmas tree and gifts in the front window so it's easily visible from the street. It's too tempting for them to smash the window and grab the wrapped packages.
- Burglars look for occupancy cues like outdoor lights burning 24 hours a day, piled up newspapers, or advertising flyers hanging on the door knob. Use an inexpensive light timer when you are away and ask a neighbor to keep the front of your home clean of papers and debris.
- Burglars know to look for the hidden door key near the front entrance. Don't hide spare keys under rocks, in flowerpots, or above door ledges. Instead give the spare key to a trusted neighbor.
- Burglars prefer to enter through unlocked doors or windows. Sliding windows that are not secure can be seen from distance. One holiday problem can occur when exterior Christmas light extension cords are run inside through a window and prevent it from being secured. Hire an electrician or handyman to install an inexpensive exterior outlet for your holiday lights.
- Don't post your family name on your mailbox or on your house. A burglar can call directory assistance to get your telephone number and call your home while in front of your house to confirm that you are away.
- Don't leave descriptive telephone answering machine messages like, "You've reached the Wilson's...we're away skiing for the Christmas holidays...please leave a message." Burglars love to hear that they have plenty of time to break in and completely ransack your home.

After Christmas day, don't pile up empty gift boxes from your new computer, DVD player, or stereo receiver on the street for the garbage man. Burglars appreciate knowing that you have expensive gifts inside for them to steal. Break them down or cut them up to conceal the items better. After a lucrative burglary, the chances of being burglarized again are increased to steal the new replacement products.

Holiday Shopping and Safety:

The police department wants to remind everyone that this is the season for crimes of opportunity, such as purse snatching and car burglaries. Citizens need to exercise extra care when shopping and carrying arm-loads of packages to parked cars:

- Do not shop alone and avoid shopping at night
- Avoid carrying large sums of money, use credit/debit cards to shop
- When approaching or leaving your vehicle be aware of your surroundings and observant of others in your immediate vicinity
- Lock your vehicle when you park it, and if you must shop at night, park in a well-lighted area
- Be prepared to enter your vehicle without having to rummage for your car keys
- Ask mall or store security for an escort if there is any suspicious activity near your vehicle
- Do not leave valuables in plain sight in unoccupied vehicles
- When traveling always keep your doors locked



Curbside items may only be placed at the curb after 5:00 pm on the day before collection. *Exception, on the first Sunday of each month items may be placed at the curb after noon for Monday pickup.

Please use your underground containers. Liners may be obtained at Ace Hardware. Recycle containers may be obtained at City Hall. For repairs and replacement contact Jim Shumacher at 561-718-5888.
