THE MAYOR'S CORNER

Dear Residents,

Let's start with business and end with celebration!

As directed by the City Council, and confirmed by our financial statements, our City Manager and City Staff have been working aggressively to control spending. These efforts will continue without considering the promise that a portion of our President's stimulus package may arrive to benefit our City. After recently meeting with Congressman Klein, I did not come away feeling as if Atlantis would receive any funding made available by the stimulus package so we must act as if we are on our own. Despite this, we will stand in line for any stimulus funding that may be available in the event that the trickle down effect actually trickles our way.

With the great weather we have been having, our residents are finding it irresistible to get "out and about". Bikers, joggers, and walkers are out in full force so please remember the rules of the road when taking part in these activities. Because we do not have sidewalks in our city, all of us must share the road regardless if some may feel that pedestrian traffic should be restricted in some fashion. Vehicles caught "playing chicken" with pedestrians may make some feel as if they have the upper-hand because they outweigh them by several thousand pounds, but make no mistake that exposing any pedestrian traffic to this danger will be met with swift and precise enforcement. ATLANTIS CITY COUNCIL NEWS:

The Atlantis Local Planning Agency was called to order February 18th, at 7:15 PM.

Ordinance No. 408-Amending the City’s Comprehensive Development Plan to Adopt Annual Capital Improvement Element Update was approved 5-0 during the public hearing.

The Council meeting followed at 7:30 PM.

Upon first reading, Ordinance #408 passed 5-0. This is an added requirement by the State Legislature even though Atlantis is built out and no new capital projects are planned. Atlantis has maintenance only in its budget.

Miscellaneous Business: With mixed blessings, City Clerk Joan Cannata-Fox is retiring. We will miss her dedication and amiable ways. She has been a joy to know and work with. Best of Luck, Joan!

Voting 5-0, Council appointed Jude Cochran as the new City Clerk. Ms. Cochran had been with our Police Department for a number of years. We look forward to working with her in her new position.

Congratulations to Manny Fernandez and Michael Dahlgren as they both begin their new unopposed terms.

Former Mayor Howell was in attendance for the Council Meeting and was greeted by Mayor and Council.

Mayor Pro Tem David Kintz reminded everyone that the 50th anniversary of Atlantis is coming April 4th and to please do all you can to support this event.

Councilmember Cathy Higgins and Council are looking into grant money for resurfacing the City’s tennis courts. They are in need of new coatings.

POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS by .. CHIEF ROBERT MANGOLD

Dark List Program: Many of our residents will soon be heading to their summer homes outside of Atlantis. The police department recommends that these residents help to ensure the security of their homes by listing them with the department prior to departing Atlantis.

Once we receive the necessary information, and the home is unoccupied, police officers will perform periodic security checks of these residences. If anything is found to be amiss, the resident and /or their emergency contact will be notified so that appropriate action can be taken to correct the problem.

Reminder, Golf Carts-Traffic Statutes & City Ordinance: Florida Statute 316.003 defines golf carts as motor vehicles, and as such, golf carts are subject to the same laws that govern any other motor vehicle, i.e., a car. For example, golf carts must stop for traffic control devices and must drive in the appropriate lane. Golf cart drivers that fail to comply with applicable traffic laws may receive a moving traffic citation for violations state traffic statutes.

In addition to state statutes, City Ordinance# 374 stipulates that golf cart operators must be a minimum of 16 years of age, and possess either a valid Florida Driver’s License or a valid Florida Identification Card. This ordinance also limits the number of occupants in any golf cart to the number of seats on the cart. The ordinance permits a child under the age of seven to ride on the lap of an adult passenger (18 years or older) who is not operating the golf cart.

Atlantis Police Officers routinely enforce all Florida Traffic Statutes and City of Atlantis Ordinances.

The Parade:

The parade will assemble in the parking lot of the Atlantis Golf Club, across from City Hall, beginning at 3:00 PM. If you want to be part of the parade, you can! You can walk, ride a bike, or drive your golf cart. And if you have a classic car and want to be part of the parade, please call Mo Thornton at 965-1744.

If you just want to watch, you can line up along the parade route (down Orange Tree Drive and Atlantis Boulevard from City Hall to Atlantis Country Club) or watch it as it passes by the event site. We'll have volunteers to assist you.

Getting there:

Depending on where you live, you can walk, drive your car to general parking, or drive your golf cart to Atlantis Country Club. If you have a golf cart, that will be the most convenient way to get to and from the festivities. If you drive, think about carpooling with a neighbor. Please note that portions of Orange Tree Drive and Atlantis Boulevard will be closed to general traffic along the parade route from 4 PM until approximately 5 PM. During that time, cars will be diverted to Villa Drive North.

Parking:

Parking for golf carts and bikes will be in the "front" parking lot at Atlantis Country Club. Residents will park cars in the lot at JFK Medical Center (east of The Atriums on JFK Drive) and take *Molly's Trolley* to the party site (she'll bring you back, too). We'll have volunteers directing traffic for you.

Fireworks:

Everyone will be able to see the fireworks display from the area where all the other activities take place.

Special Notes:

Dress is casual; there's a water slide for the kids, so parents might want to bring towels along!





Manager's Notes

By now you should have **Silver** 2009 decals for your vehicle. If your decals are blue or any other color, they are not for the current year. Please see the dispatcher with your current vehicle information to obtain your 2009 decals. Resident decals are an important part of the City's safety program. Please help us help you by obtaining yours today.

Please call City Hall if you notice maintenance items in need of attention. From time to time, it is reported to us that residents direct the city's maintenance staff while they are performing other duties within the city. The maintenance employees work at the direction of the Utilities Director and the City Manager. We always want to know about any items that need maintenance within the city. By reporting the problems to City Hall we can properly schedule the work that needs to be done.

The fire hydrants will be painted within the next few weeks. Should there be shrubs or other landscaping impeding the hydrant, it will be trimmed at that time. That is for the convenience of maintenance as well as the safety of those who are served by the hydrant. Adequate clearances must be maintained to insure that the Fire Department can operate the hydrant in case of an emergency.


